Hello out there in Lompoc Valley Distance Club Land

John Trettin would be proud. The Lompoc Valley Distance Club's season opened with 182 participating in the Ninth Annual Trettin Memorial 5K last Saturday at Cabrillo. Miguel Ortiz was the overall winner in 17:20, Sara Foss the first female in 21:35 on the tough cross country course. "I haven't heard any complaints, except that my bullhorn would go out sometimes," said race director Kent Yankee. Yankee, like Ortiz and Foss, is a Cabrillo grad. The former state meet cross country man was fifth overall in 19:19. Yankee, whose tireless efforts have made the Trettin Run one of the most successful events in the 33-year history of the local distance club, thanked LVDC timers Karl Seelandt and Wayne Davis and all the other volunteers. "It is an honor to do this for Dr. Trettin," said Yankee, who was coached by Trettin at Cabrillo in the late 1990s. Trettin, an orthopedist, was a distance runner at the University of Wisconsin. He remained a running enthusiast and regularly competed at the Boston Marathon. He passed away after being involved in an accident while bicycle touring in Germany in 2000. Proceeds from the Trettin Run go to Trettin fund, which awards scholarships to college-bound Lompoc Valley high school grads.

Next up for the LVDC: the Ray Gil 5K/10K at La Purisima Mission on Saturday, May 9. With this one the cause is the Mission, that favorite stomping grounds of local joggers. Remember, this one is a dog-friendly romp, as long as your dog is friendly and he or she keeps you on a leash.

MARATHONS: Speaking of the Seelandts, Mary Lou Seelandt is preparing for the 24th Annual Big Sur Marathon on Sunday, April 26. She was first in the 50-59 division at the Trettin 5K. Karl, meanwhile, is bound for the 113th Boston Marathon on Monday, April 20. Karl will be back for Big Sur. He'll be part of the support team for Mary Lou and the Sweeney Buzzards. The Buzzards are a group of locals who have gained fame while logging many miles on Sweeney Road on the east side of the Lompoc Valley. The Buzzards are led again this year by Jack Webb, aka Joe Friday. Jack, a tough old Marine buzzard, has been under the weather, but is rounding back into shape. He plans to do the full Big Sur Marathon, half on Saturday, half on Sunday.

RELAY FOR LIFE: Webb's Relay for Life team, Buzzards for Life, has a benefit dinner at La Purisima Hall on Boston Marathon Monday, April 20. The 24-hour Relay for Life cancer-prevention walk at Huyck Stadium is the
