With the Trettin 5K under our belts - great job! - we proceed to the Ray Gil 5K/10K on Saturday, May 15.

But before we do, members should know that the Trettin 5K, at least at its current site, is in jeopardy. Race director Kent Yankee passes on that the Department of Fish and Game, taking note probably because of more publicity this year, came to him and said that he couldn't use the Cabrillo cross country course because????? Later that day, the DF&G relented and allowed the race to go on as scheduled.

Do we have any club members who work for the DF&G? Can someone please explain this?

My reaction, and I'm only half-kidding here, is that we should employ the same tactic that the Native American tribes used at Alcatraz in 1969. We're taking over this unused federal area - the cross country course - precisely because it is unused. There's an 1868 treaty that allows Native Americans to do that. This was the logic employed by representatives of more than 300 tribes when they took over Alcatraz. My grandfather on my father's side was born on a Cherokee reservation in Oklahoma. Through him, I am part Cherokee and Blackfoot. I am sure there are other representatives of other tribes in the Lompoc Valley Distance Club.

Ray Gil 5K/10K, Saturday, May 15: Here's the second annual Ray Gil 5K/10K, which is a continuation of the decades-old May Mission Run at La Purisima Mission. It features a fast 5K (more like 2.8 miles) run/walk and a bonafide 10K run. The 10K starts, like the 5, on the lower loop, then has a couple of nice climbs on the upper before finishing in the relatively flat and fast mode. Fruit, cookies and water for all. Proceeds are shared with La Purisima Mission State Historic Park.

By the way, as many of you know, Ray Gil was/is 100 percent Mescalero Apache. I'm sure he would approve of our takeover of the Cabrillo cross country course for the Trettin Run, knowing, as he did/does, that the Lompoc Valley Distance Club treads lightly on Mother Earth. And if anyone from the DFG wants to argue the point, I'll personally stack my environmentally-sound credentials against yours any day of the year, and twice on Earth Day.
