Valley of the Flowers Half-Marathon



Hello out there in Lompoc Valley Distance Club Land

Is this the season of La Purisima Mission's discontent, or what? It may not compare to the Chumash Rebellion of 1824. But the September 1 closure of La Purisima and most of the rest of the parks in the state system, including El Capitan, Refugio and Gaviota, would definitely put a crimp in the recreational style of Santa Barbara County. Take the Lompoc Valley Distance Club and La Purisima, for example. The Mission is the site for three of the five events on the annual LVDC schedule. Last Saturday's Lompoc Lizard Breath Fenceline Fun Run at the Mission was good fun. (See the run notes in this newsletter). But the status of the 33rd Annual Valley of the Flowers Half-Marathon, set for Saturday, September 26 at the Mission, is inextricably linked with the open/closed status of La Purisima. And the half-marathon is linked with the LVDC's scholarship fund, which distributes thousands of dollars annually. This year's scholarship winners, by the way, were Kaitlyn Munoz and Kyle Pickles out of Lompoc High and Katherine Avila and David Fraats out of Cabrillo.

LVDC board members, including half-marathon race director Betty Lee and yours truly, decided to take it on faith that the Mission would stay open. Will it? Back in May when the governor made his parks-closure proposal, the thought was that it wouldn't. A few weeks later, when a raise-the-fees proposal gathered momentum, the thought was that it would. A few days later, when that proposal was shot down, maybe it wouldn't. A few days after that, when the federal government said that the state parks closure was illegal, maybe it would. State budget wrangling continues. For those of us who like the parks, using them regularly and recreationally, hope springs eternal that a way will be found to keep them open. I've written all my elected officials. With La Purisima I used the 1930s Civilian Conservation Corps logic. The CCC rebuilt the Mission during a serious economic downturn. We can keep it open now. And, for state parks in general, there's a recent study indicating parks contribute \$2 to the general fund for each \$1 they cost. This makes the governor's proposal look like a classic "cutting off your nose to spite your face" piece of politics. "The closure of La Purisima Mission is unacceptable," said Lompoc Mayor Dick DeWees a few weeks ago, drawing a cheer from Mission lovers. DeWees, like many of the rest of us, hopes the state will find a way to keep the parks up and running. But, in the meantime, he's working on a deal by which the City of Lompoc would take over at La Purisima.

To which I add my favorite 1930s football cheer...

"Ma-he, ma-hi, ma-ho.

Ma rum-a-nickle, bum-a-nickle soap, fat, rag.

Hobble-gobble ricker-racker,
Hobble-gobble firecracker,
Zis-boom-bah.
La Purisima Mission, rah-rah-rah!!”

VALLEY OF THE FLOWERS HALF-MARATHON. Betty Lee and her committee are meeting and planning for the half to take place at La Purisima Mission State Park. The sponsorship request letters will go out shortly. If anyone knows of a likely sponsor, let us know so we can add them to our request list.

Lizard Breath 2009. The 8th Annual Lompoc Lizard Breath Fenceline Fun Run was held Saturday, July 11, 2009 at La Purisima Mission. The competitors enjoyed cool, cloudy conditions for the first hour, from 8 to 9. By 9 it was sunny, increasing the degree of difficulty for those still out on the very sandy and hilly course. There were 32 finishers, which is a record for this Lompoc Valley Distance Club event, beating the previous high of 31 established in 2003 and 2004. Men’s winner Levi Block, a 17-year-old Cabrillo High student, finished in 58 minutes and 30 seconds. Micky Sederburg, 34, of Vandenberg AFB was second in 1:02.24. The women’s winner was 16-year-old Nikki Peirtsegaele, also a Cabrillo High student. Peirtsegaele clocked 1:08:43, the second-fastest female time in the history of the Lizard Breath fun. An incorrect announcement at the finish by race director Lizard Breath AI gave the winning women’s watermelon to April Fienga, who was actually the second-fastest walker behind Julie Campos. Nonetheless, the event was judged an overall success because of the efforts of tireless volunteers, including Nancy Perry, Lee Holloway, Wayne Davis, Mary Lou Seelandt, Olga Lucaric, Harvey Wynne, Jack Webb, Steve Crummy, Gudrun Fink, Jim Seaslak, Tricia Tiggerman, Jillian Voyles, Mike Benson, Janis Hunt and Two-Ton Tawny. Thanks to Ron Cortopassi, the LVDC’s behind-the-scenes insurance man, and, of course, La Purisima Mission State Historic Park. Course records remain with Craig Farley’s 53:21 in 2002 and Angie Gonzalez’s 1:05:43 in 2003.
