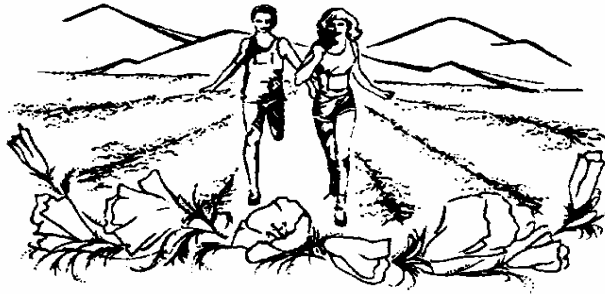

## Hello out there in Lompoc Valley Distance Club Land

While the LVDC heads into fall-winter hibernation, the high school-college cross country season picks up the slack. The Santa Barbara County High School Cross Country Championships at River Park in Lompoc on Friday, October 26, drew approximately 600 runners, with Cabrillo's boys and the Dos Pueblos girls emerging as winners. As always, Lompoc High coach Jim Warrick, wife Peg Warrick, plus the staff and former staff (Bill Graham) at LHS turned out in fine fashion to put on a great competition, plus food from Taco Bell. Coming after a warm week during which the sky was smoky from fires to the south, the runners were blessed with typically cool, smog-free Lompoc running conditions. "It was like a gift from God," said boys' winner Miguel Ortiz of Cabrillo.

Up at Corvallis, Oregon, Saturday, October 26, Cabrillo's Michael Coe helped the Cal Bears to a third place finish in the Pac-10 championships with a 16th in the 8K. The Bears, underclass-heavy with great sophs like Coe, gained their highest-ever national ranking, moving up to eighth in the month of October. Joining Coe and Cal at the NCAA Western Regional in Eugene, Oregon, November 10 are Cabrillo grad Colin Hacker and his UC Irvine Anteaters. Hacker was 26th at the Big West championships at SLO Saturday. Back on October 23, running for Westmont College, Lompoc High's Nick Martin was 23rd in the Golden State Athletic Conference championships.

Lompoc High grads Ariana Fabing and Orion Casteel are having good seasons running cross country for Hancock College. In the Western State Conference championships Fabing was 26th in the women's 5K while Casteel was 61st in the men's 8K. Casteel showed great conditioning, by the way at the Valley of the Flowers Half-Marathon, finishing sixth in 1:28:35.

Speaking of the Flowers half, Tym Stark continues to make progress. The 51-year old who collapsed at our half September 22 with an apparent arrhythmia, is now walking, talking, responding to e-mails, etc, as you can see on the Stark family website. Check in with Tym at <http://stark-family.com>.

### CHECK WITH THE RACE DIRECTORS TO CONFIRM DATES AND TIMES.

**SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 11, 9:00 AM. SAN LUIS MOUNTAIN 10K RUN (LAGUNA LAKE PARK), SAN LUIS OBISPO.** This is a rugged 10K trail race that climbs the ancient volcanic peak Cerro San Luis. The course is speckled with challenging single track, fire road, and double track trails. With an elevation gain of 1556' and set against Laguna Lake with views of the coastal range and an overlook of downtown San Luis Obispo, this is no ordinary 10K. Entry fees are \$35 ahead of time and \$45 on race day, \$5 less for those with a student ID. The entry fee includes awards to the top three men and women overall and in many other divisions, a T-shirt, post-race refreshments, and a raffle (must be present to win). TURKEY TROTS:** A series of age group races from first grade through open/masters at the Hagerman Sports Complex, 3300 Skyway Drive in Santa Maria. Race distances are 1/2 mile for 1st/2nd grade, 1 mile for 3rd/4th, 2 miles for 5th/6th, and 3 miles for 7th/8th, 9th/12th, and open (which has age divisions for 18-25, 26-35, 36-45, & 46+).
